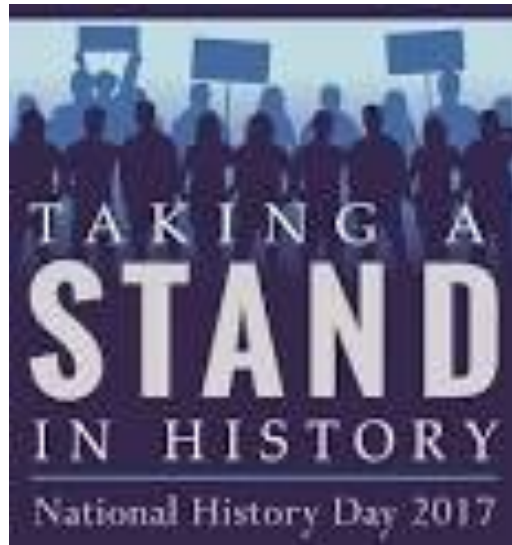

Exhibit students should make sure their Process Paper and Bibliography remain with their exhibit throughout the day. Please do not remove exhibits until after all judging is done at about 2:00.

Final results will be announced at the awards ceremony for all categories.

PUBLIC VIEWING OF PROJECTS & PRESENTATIONS

PAPERS & WEBSITES: Website and Paper entries are available for viewing at: nhdinwi.weebly.com. Paper and website interviews are closed to the public. Only students being interviewed will be allowed in the room.

DOCUMENTARIES & PERFORMANCES: If your time permits, try to test your documentary prior to your assigned presentation time. The rooms will be open from 8-8:45 and again during the mid-morning break.

Documentary and Performance presentations are open to the public. We ask that you do not enter or exit a room while a film or performance is underway. Judges should open the door during the interviews and setup/takedown; during this time, you can quietly exit and enter. Photographs of presentations in progress may be taken only with student permission. Cell phones should be turned off during presentations. Please show respect to the presenting students by remaining quiet in the hallways.

EXHIBITS: While student interviews are taking place, only judges and students are allowed in the exhibit room. Students will only be allowed in the exhibit room at the time of their interview.

The public may view the exhibits from approximately 12-1 and briefly after final round judging is complete d at approximately 2:00. Students may not take down their exhibits until after the final round judging is complete.

AWARDS CEREMONY

A short awards ceremony will take place in Bradley Fine Arts Theatre, Auditorium, at 3:00.

All results will be announced at this time. Three state finalists and one alternate will be chosen from each project category and division.

Note: **Senior Documentaries, Junior Performances, and Senior Performances:** For purposes of scheduling, Group and Individual projects have been combined in rooms, but will be judged as separate categories. State Finalists will be selected in each category for each division.
